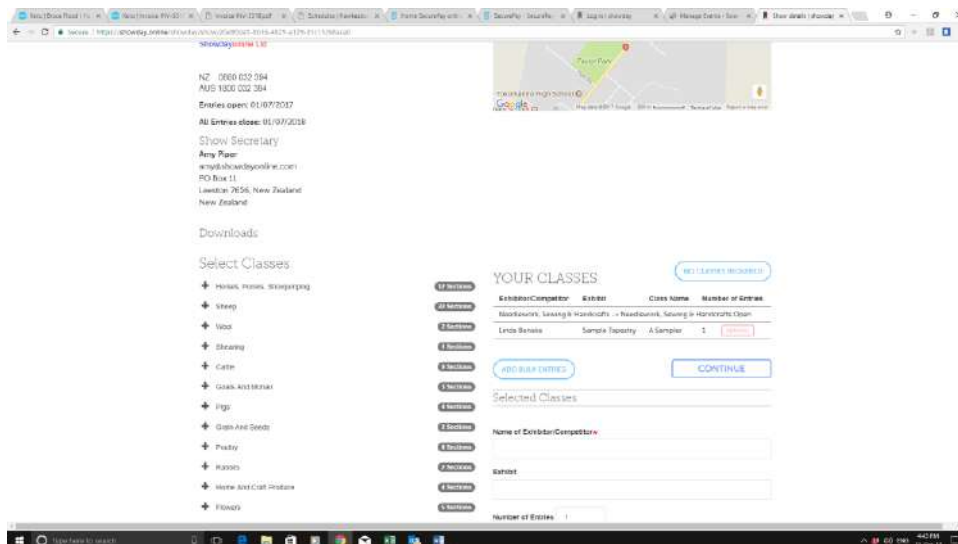

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants

*Here's what you need:* ¼ tspn grated nutmeg

250g [8ozs] sultanas ½ tspn ground ginger

250g chopped raisins ½ tspn ground cloves

250g currents 250g butter

125g [4ozs] chopped mixed peel 250g soft brown sugar

90g [3ozs] chopped red glace cherries ½ tspn lemon essence or

90g chopped blanched almonds grated lemon rind

1/3 cup sherry or brandy ½ tspn almond essence

250g plain flour ½ tspn vanilla essence

60g [2ozs] self raising flour 4 large eggs

**Here is what you do:** - Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave 1 hour or preferably overnight. Sift together the flour and spices. Cream the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm [8"] and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3-4 hours. Allow cake to cool in tin.

**NOTE** – to ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested that the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces, the cherries into 4-6 pieces and the almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.

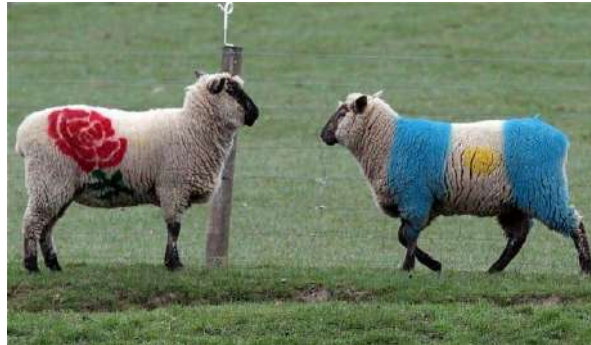
